A: Interested Girl Scout troops must commit to a two-year correspondence period when they're expected to write or e-mail their assigned volunteer at least once a month. While there's no fee to join, the troop covers the international postage expenses.

## New this fall! Girl Scout Biking Program

This seven-week series will show 6th-12th graders the basics of road and trail riding, maneuvering and bike handling, road and trail safety, and bicycle maintenance.
